Dear Parents and Carers,

At Stondon Lower school, we believe in offering a curriculum which is broad and balanced. As part of your child's educational experience, we aim to promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive taught programme of Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education. We aim to give our children the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live healthy, safe, productive and fulfilled lives, both now and in the future.

From September 2020 and no later than Summer term 20201, it is mandatory for primary schools to teach Relationships Education and Health education. In addition, it is strongly encouraged by the government for primary schools to teach additional Sex Education to that which is already covered within the Science curriculum, after an initial consultation with parents and Carers. This means we have had to make some changes to what we teach. For more information, here is the link to this government guidance:

The new guidance focuses on healthy relationships and keeping children safe in the modern world. It also covers a wide range of topics relating to physical and mental health, wellbeing, safeguarding and healthy relationships. Learning about the emotional, social and physical aspects of growing up, will give our children the information, skills and positive values to have safe, fulfilling relationships and will help them take responsibility for their own well-being. All of the teaching will be age-appropriate and will meet the needs of the children in the class.

This is part of our school's PSHE education programme which is taught throughout the school in every year group using the Coram Life Education SCARF (Safety, Caring, Achievement, Resilience and Friendship) resource. All teaching in PSHE takes place in a safe learning environment and is underpinned by our school ethos and values.

As a school community, we are committed to working in partnership with parents. We would like to take the opportunity to consult with parents to gain your views. We ask you to read the following document which is attached to this Parent Mail for ease of reference:
