We have raised over £130 today - Thank you so much




Children in Need 2020


Opportunity to join the team

The children need your help with this quest and to be successful!

The more that the children read within a week the further around the reading challenge board the class travels! Children are encouraged to read every day to an adult at a convenient time that suits you. This includes our older children. Quite often when children have learnt to read, the importance of reading with an adult is lost. However, it is still very important that children have the opportunity to discuss what they are reading with an adult as this develops their comprehension about what they have read. Questions to support these discussions can be found on page 111 in the school diaries.



Additionally, this year, to promote reading, we have a reading focused assembly every Monday during which our year 4 children volunteer to read the younger children a story. Next half term children from all year groups are invited to share a story or passage from a book they enjoy with the rest of the school. I find nothing more rewarding but to see children proudly sharing their reading and their love for it! We also encourage you to read to your child. If adults share a love of reading, children will emulate this even more. Therefore, we are looking for any volunteers that would be willing to read in assemblies too.
