Robin Class News

Robins have just started a new book 'Stanley's Stick' and enjoyed their 'wow' activity. Stanley's stick turned in to so many different things in his imaginative world. Robins enjoyed the story and talked about what they would like their stick to be. Everyone joined in with our whole class discussion using their imagination. There were some excellent ideas such as a torch, pen, jaguar, dinosaur and musical instrument. This book is very poetic and use lots of alliteration. If you share some of the tongue-twisters with your child, I'm sure she/he will enjoy it. In Maths, the children have just finished 'one fewer than a given number' up to 5. They used a range of different types of real objects e.g. bottles, pretend food, toy cutlery, real fruit and cubes to learn the concept of more and fewer. The majority of them have achieved the learning objectives. In other areas of learning, the children really enjoyed exploring 'light and dark' using torches, lights and lamps. They also loved the shadow puppet show (The Three Billy Goats Gruff and using their own shadow puppets). Robins really surprised me when they performed the puppet show because all the participants were very confident about saying their lines and used expressive tones of voice. I enjoyed watching their show. The children have just started Christmas themed art and craft activities. The first one was a star. We displayed all the lovely stars on the window pane at the front door and main door into Robins' class. Some children created angels using cupcake cases and lollipop sticks. They are going to make Christmas trees, cards, baubles and more.

The start of Robins' Christmas play practice really cheered us up and raised our spirits as it indicated that the festive season had just begun. Although it is very different from previous years, the children are still enjoying every single minute of their practice.

Puffin Class News

In Puffins, we have been busy in school and at home. In Maths, we have learnt 2D and 3D shapes and we have started numbers to 20. In English, we pretended to be Mr Big and wrote what he thought and we looked at story telling. In science we have looked at Life Cycles of some animals and at food chains. We have also started practising our Christmas play lines. We are continuing doing gymnastics. Next week we are going to start the week with an exciting live lesson about animals in Chester Zoo. I can't wait! But most of all I can't wait to see all of my little Puffins again!

Kestrel Class News

This week in Kestrels we have been feeling the Christmas spirit! We have started our new book called 'A Christmas Collar' and have been writing diary entries and wanted posters based on the story. In Maths we have started to look at money. We can now recognise coins and notes and are beginning to add together amounts of money.

In science we have been learning how to keep ourselves healthy. We have completed exercise experiments and designed our own healthy menu.

We have also started practising our lines for the Christmas performance!

In Toucans this week we have started looking at a new book in English called 'Mini rabbit not lost.' We have been using the pictures to write our own version of the story and have been focusing the skills of using adjectives, adverbs, speech, verbs and prepositions.

In maths we have begun learning about multiplication and division. So far we have looked at equal groups and the 3 times table. In computing we have been exploring 'scratch' and how to write an algorithm to program a character to move.

We have also begun working on our Christmas animation which the children are really excited about.

We have been finding out all about the Antarctic, now moving on to the Rainforest and the Amazon.
