hroughout last week we were taking part in Children in Needs '5 ways to thrive.' The children engaged in a number of wellbeing activities focusing on mental wellbeing with the aim to help children feel better about themselves as well as helping others.



#### **Robin Class News**

I would like to say a huge 'Thank you' to all the parents and carers who have been busy supporting Robins' home learning throughout this week. I really appreciate that you have shared your child's learning with me and I saw so much positive learning take place at home.

For Maths Robins worked on comparing two groups of objects using the maths vocabulary 'more', 'fewer' and 'the same'. Next week the children will learn about 'change within 5' ('one more' than a given number). In Literacy, Robins are continuing 'I will NOT ever NEVER eat a tomato' and will carry out a writing task, which is to write a shopping list independently. In Phonics Robins will continue learning Phase 3 sounds, tricky words and high frequency words. During P.E. lessons, the children will learn a range of different movements. As we are just about to see another seasonal change, we are going to do some art and craft activities using autumnal objects.

#### **Puffin Class News**

In Puffins we have finished our work on additions and subtractions within 10. They have now started learning about 2D shapes. In the next week we are also going to learn about 3D shapes. In English we have finished using non-narrative writing with recipes and have now started our new book called Mr Big. The children will continue using this book to produce their own narrative work using Capital letters, the correct punctuation as well as 'and.' Finally, we have also learnt about different habitats in Science and we have started working on a role play in French. In Art the children have done an observational drawing of their hands! They are such fabulous artists!

#### Kestrel Class News

In Kestrels this week we have started to use the column method in our maths lessons to help us with subtraction. In English we have been looking at the painting 'Tiger in a Tropical Storm' by Henry Rousseau. We have written our initial responses to the painting and have been writing in first person, pretending we are the tiger!

In Art we have been looking at the artist Andy Warhol and exploring some of his Pop Art. We have created our own Pop Art portraits using oil pastels, and made sure we included lots of bright colours. Some of us made it look like our hair was green!

#### Toucan Class News

In Toucan Class we have been enjoying learning about our new Geography topic—Rainforests. We have been learning about the climate of a rainforest and what the difference is between climate and weather. We have also used the iPads to find out about different rainforests around the world and where they are, locating the equator and the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn. In English we have continued using the book, Dr Xargle's Book of Earthlets. We have out together a glossary to explain some of the words used in the book and will be using these in our own piece of non-fiction writing. In Maths we are nearing the end of our addition and subtraction unit, in which we have been working with 3-digit numbers in the column method.

#### Hummingbird Class News

Last week and this week in Hummingbirds, we have been working on measuring, using a ruler correctly, measuring the perimeter of a rectilinear shape, converting measurements and problem solving. A very busy couple of weeks! Next week we are moving on to multiplying and will begin with multiplying multiples of 10. In English we have finished our most recent book by writing our own persuasive speeches about a life without the dark! What an amazing job we have done. Some of us were even confident enough to deliver our speeches to the class with both expression and passion. We have also been learning all about Hinduism and the recent festival of light, Diwali and were fortunate to have had Max offer to tell us all about his own experiences when celebrating with his family. We are continuing to find out about Antarctica and the Arctic and have just began to find out about block printing in art.

## **Christmas Lunch**

Christmas lunch at Stondon is always a big deal! Usually it is the one day of the year that all of the together, the hall is full of chatter and Christmas cheer and is often children and staff eat lunch followed up by a staff sing-a-long. Although Christmas lunch will be different from other years as we will be unable to eat all together we are determined to still go ahead and have a great time.
